

Ice Cream Sandwich Cake

1/2 cup hot fudge ice cream topping, warmed 1 tub (8 oz.) whipped topping, thawed, divided 1 pkg. (3.9 oz.) chocolate flavored instant pudding 12 vanilla ice cream sandwiches 16 chocolate sandwich cookies, chopped (about 2 cups) divided



Whisk fudge topping and 1 cup of whipped topping in medium bowl until blended. Add dry pudding mix; stir 2 minutes. Stir in 1 cup cookies. Arrange 4 ice cream sandwiches, side-by-side, on a 24-inch-long piece of aluminum foil; cover with half the whipped topping mixture. Repeat layers. Top with remaning sandwiches. Frost with remaining whipped topping; press remaining cookies into top and sides of dessert. Wrap loosely with foil. Freeze for 4 hours.
