Eggroll in a Bowl



- 1 lb ground pork
 - 1 - 16 oz bag dry coleslaw mix
 - 5 cloves garlic, minced
 - 1 teaspoon ginger, minced
 - 1/2 cup soy sauce
 - 2 tablespoons sesame oil
 - green onions, for garnish
1. In a small bowl, combine garlic, ginger, soy sauce and sesame oil. Set aside.
 2. In a large skillet, brown the pork over medium-high heat.
 3. Add the shredded cabbage and carrots, and stir to combine.
 4. Add the sauce mixture to the pork and veggies. Stir and cook for 3-5 minutes, until cabbage has begun to wilt but is still crisp.
 5. Serve over rice, garnished with green onions, if desired.
