Operation Arbor Beautifies Shell Knob, Mo.

On November 4th, the CCC Park in Shell Knob, Mo., received six new trees through Operation Arbor, a program sponsored by Carroll Electric to advance arboriculture and demonstrate how trees and electricity can live in harmony. The Cooperative understands the environmental and aesthetic benefits of trees and endorses a harmonious landscape of trees and electricity through its vegetation management program. It is well known that trees in close proximity to power lines can be hazardous and can cause an interruption in the flow of electricity. Recent storms have brought to light the importance of clear power line easements.

Through Operation Arbor, the Cooperative has an opportunity to teach proper placement and care of trees.

A team of tree professionals, including two certified arborists, worked on the tree planting project for the beautification of the CCC Park. This park is on Highway YY at the location of an historic Civilian Conservation Corps Camp from the Great Depression era. The park is maintained by several groups including the National Forest Service, Shell Knob Lions Club, Master Gardeners of the Ozarks, and the Dogwood Trail Garden Club.

Mississippi Pot Roast



1 (3-4 lbs.) chuck roast
1 packet ranch dressing mix
1 packet au jus gravy mix

1 stick (8 T) butter
5 to 10 pepperoncinis, pickled
Salt and ground pepper, if desired

1. Place roast in the slow cooker and sprinkle the top with ranch dressing mix and the au jus gravy mix. Place peppers on top of the mixes, add butter.
2. Cook over low heat for 8 hours. Serve over noodles, rice or mashed potatoes.
